

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CITY OF MILACA COUNCIL MINUTES June 21, 2022

Call to Order Roll Call

Mayor Pedersen called the regular meeting of the Milaca City Council to order at 6:32 p.m. Upon roll call, the following council members were present: Mayor Harold Pedersen; Councilors: Dave Dillan, Norris Johnson, and Lindsee Larsen. Councilors Absent:

Staff Present: City Manager Tammy Pfaff, City Attorney Damien Toven, Assistant City Clerk Deloris Katke, Police Chief Quinn Rasmussen, Public Works Supervisor Gary Kirkeby, Administrative Communications Specialist Mary Mickelson, Public Works/Events Coordinator Mark Wubben, Public Works-Troy Roelofs, Warne Johnson, Liquor Store Manager Vicki Jeys, City Treasurer Jessica Humphreys, and Fire Chief Jesse Gerads.

Others Present: Marshall Lind, Dan Hollenkamp, Ken Muller, Andy and Jojean Ziegler, James and Roxanne Gerads, Chloe Smith, Ryan Meyer, and Molly Thompson.

Approval of the Agenda

Mayor Pedersen called for a motion to approve the agenda. Motion for approval from Johnson. Dillan seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously upon roll call of all council members.

Approval of the Minutes – May 19, 2022 and June 6, 2022

Mayor Pedersen called for a motion to approve the minutes of May 19, 2022. Motion by Dillan to approve the minutes. Johnson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously upon roll call of all council members. Mayor Pedersen called for a motion to approve the minutes of June 6, 2022. Motion by Johnson to approve the minutes. Larsen seconded the motion. Mayor Pedersen discussed the corrections to the minutes to add at least one and multiple employees, mayor and one employee attend mediation and no mention of the letter he read. Mayor Pedersen called for a motion to amend the minutes. Motion by Dillan for approval. Johnson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously upon roll call of all council members.

Approval of Bills

Mayor Pedersen called for a motion to approve the bills. Motion by Johnson for approval of the bills. Larsen seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously upon roll call of all council members.

Open Forum

Jim's Mille Lacs Disposal. Roxanne discussed with council the vandalism to the portable toilets. She stated one was burned at Rec Park and they have graffiti on all of them. One was damaged on the inside. The council will check with our insurance company to see if they are covered.

Requests, Communications, Petitions and Complaints

Update State -

Update County -

Update Townships – Norris asked about the grading. Gary mentioned that they have been grading the airport road.

Mayor announced Mille Lacs Health Systems is moving into the old clinic in four to six months. Dillan thanked Buzz on all his hard work.

Annual Audit – Molly Thompson and Ryan Meyer CPA from Schlenner Wenner and Co. Molly presented the audit reports. She stated they obtain records, inquiries, analytical procedures and stated the city has an unmodified (Clean) Opinion. She stated the audit went smoothly with a positive working relationship with management. She stated they helped with audit adjustments, the lack of segregation of

duties and they prepared the financial statements. She stated all of these findings are common and are in 95% of the audits they do. Other legal compliance items were the FDIC deposits because of the timing of deposits. There was a conflict of interest and noted the publication of the financials in which they will prepare.

The General Fund Trend Analysis and Budget Comparison. Four-year analysis shows revenues exceeded the budget almost by \$500,000 due to federal, state, FEMA, and Airport grants. Miscellaneous revenue resulted in the dissolution of the Joint Powers agreement in which the funds were transferred to the General Fund. Expenditures exceeded the budget by \$380,376 due to capital outlay expenditures, which she stated these are common findings with capital outlay.

General Fund Detail Revenue Analysis. Molly stated the intergovernmental increase is due to the grants. Interest income had a loss due to the market change and contribution and donations shows an excess in donations.

General Fund Detailed Expenditure Analysis. Molly stated insurance lines changes and the increase in capital outlay.

Unassigned Fund Balance as a Percentage of the Annual Budget. Molly stated policy sets a target for five months of operating expenditures, and we are hitting what the policy says and makes sense.

General Fund Cash Trend Analysis. Molly stated we are up about \$118,000 over the prior year resulted from transfers in.

Financial Highlights Other Governmental Funds. Molly stated these are non-major capital projects funds. She noted that the other sources and uses is due to transfers of \$47,500 out Gorecki Improvement fund and transfers in to the Gorecki Improvement Fund II of \$37,500. She stated the Cash Trend Analysis for the three funds shows the Gorecki Improvement Fund was due to the transfer out, and the Gorecki Improvement Fund II stayed relatively the same over the prior year, and the Veterans Memorial Fund actually spent \$135,000 over revenue as the project get completed.

Debt Service Funds went down \$190,000, Capital Projects Fund went up \$144,000 and Non-Major Funds went up \$31,000. Cash Trend Analysis of Other Government Funds. Molly stated debt service went down as we spent more than we brought in and Capital Projects is due to the transfer in and the other non-major funds similar year to year.

Water Enterprise Funds Financial Highlights. Water fund operating expenses were higher than revenue due to repairs and maintenance up about \$122,000 and also includes depreciation of about \$182,000 with an operation loss of about \$129,000 and with transfers in and out it ended the year to the good about \$60,000. Sewer Fund operating expenses due include depreciation of about \$77,000 and with transfer in of \$28,000 and transfers out we about broke even.

Liquor Enterprise Fund Financial Highlights. Revenue is ahead of operating expenses and we had an operating income of about \$160,000. Transfers out of about \$193,000 to support other funds, which is a loss of about \$26,000 and commented to council to keep in mind the transfers supported other funds. Enterprise Funds Cash Trend Analysis. Sewer similar year to year, liquor is down from last year and water is similar year to year.

Government Wide Asset. Total Assets of \$20,600,000 up from the previous year of \$1,100,000 and \$6,500,000 is sitting in cash and investments at the end of the year.

Government Wide Liabilities. Liabilities are at \$4,200,000 and it leaves the rest as net position as the health of the city.

Mayor Pedersen questioned page 5 of the audited financials regarding the MDA a report that summarizes the financial statements in 10 to 12 pages. Molly stated that with the 10 or 12 pages or more the audit fee goes up and most cities decide they don't want it and it isn't required. She said more government entities omit it, rather than include it.

Mayor Pedersen questioned pages 10 and 11 of the audit and Molly referred to the government wide statement page 8 of the statement of net position of \$15,923,149, which includes all infrastructure and the cash on hand, is roughly \$6,500,000 government wide. Page 12 review of the revenues and expenditures relating to the losses. Molly related the losses to the pay down of debt service and capital projects. Page 14 review of the water, sewer and liquor funds statement of net position. Molly pointed out the cash on hand is \$2,900,000 and the net position is \$6,700,000 and stated we are a healthy city. Page 75 review of the findings. Mayor asked if anything unusual. Molly said 95% similar to other cities and didn't see anything unusual. Discussion on the segregation of duties and Molly stated you would need six accountants to comply. As related to the FDIC we had to much cash on hand due to the LGA, property tax revenue all come in late December and Molly stated they see this finding frequently. At the conclusion of the audit, Mayor Pedersen called for a motion to accept the audited financial statements. Motion by Johnson for approval. Larsen seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously upon roll call of all council members.

Petition – Chickens and Bees- Dan Hollenkamp was present to discuss the changing the ordinance. Dan will need to submit the application and pay the fee. The city attorney will draw up the ordinance and Council consensus is for it go to Planning and Zoning they will make any recommendation or restrictions on the location and the amount of chickens. Dan asked if he could attend the meetings and council agreed.

ORDINANCE NO. 494 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 30 (CITY GOVERNMENT) OF THE CITY OF MILACA CODE OF ORDINANCES

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILACA DOES HEREBY ORDAIN THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCES ARE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

CHAPTER 30: CITY GOVERNMENT

Section

General Provisions

- 30.01 Committees
- 30.02 Other boards and commissions; advisory status
- 30.03 City Manager-Clerk established
- 30.04 Annual audit

City Council

- 30.15 Meetings; time and notification
- 30.16 Annual designations; officers, newspaper, and depositories
- 30.17 Presiding officer; Mayor
- 30.18 Meeting minutes
- 30.19 Order of business; agenda
- 30.20 Quorum; voting
- 30.21 Ordinances, resolutions, motions, and the like
- 30.22 Rules; suspension or amendment
- 30.23 Mayor and Council members; compensation

GENERAL PROVISIONS

§ 30.01 COMMITTEES.

- (A) The City Council may create committees, standing or special, as it deems necessary, including, but not limited to the parks, planning, personnel, budget, economic development and tourism.
- (B) These committees shall consist of as many members and perform duties, as the Council may require.

(`74 Code, § 100:30)

§ 30.02 OTHER BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS; ADVISORY STATUS.

Pursuant to M.S. § 412.621, subd. 1, as amended from time to time, there shall be no board of health as defined in M.S. § 145A.02, subd. 2, as amended from time to time, library board, park board, public utilities commission, or any other administrative board or commission, except for the administration of a function jointly with another political subdivision. The Council shall

itself be and perform the duties and exercise the powers of the board of health and shall govern and administer the library, parks and utilities as fully as other municipal functions for the administration of which no independent boards are authorized by statute for cities generally. The Council may, however, create boards or commissions to advise the Council with respect to any municipal function or activity or to investigate any subject of interest to the city.

§ 30.03 CITY MANAGER-CLERK ESTABLISHED.

- (A) The Office of City Clerk-Treasurer is hereby abolished.
- (B) Pursuant to M.S. § 412.681, as amended from time to time, the Offices of City Manager and City Clerk in this city are hereby combined in the Office of City Manager-Clerk.
- (C) The Office of City Treasurer shall be filled by appointment of the City Manager-Clerk. (Ord. 194, passed 5-17-79)

§ 30.04 ANNUAL AUDIT.

Beginning with the year in which this code becomes effective and each year thereafter, there shall be an audit of the city's financial affairs by the State Auditor or a public accountant in accordance with minimum auditing procedures prescribed by the State Auditor. ('74 Code, § 110:00) (Ord. 174, passed 12-1-76)

CITY COUNCIL

§ 30.15 MEETINGS; TIME AND NOTIFICATION.

- (A) Regular meetings of the Council shall be designated at the first regular meeting of the Council in January of each year, except that the first regular meeting shall be held on the same day as the previous year. Any regular meeting falling upon a holiday shall be held on the next following business day, unless changed by the Council, at the same time and place. All meetings, including special and adjourned meetings, shall be held in the City Hall, unless otherwise designated by the Council with proper notice.
- (B) Special meetings of the Council may be called by the Mayor or by any two members of the Council by writing filed with the City Manager-Clerk. At least one day before the meeting the City Manager-Clerk shall notify each member of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting by causing written notice thereof to be delivered to him or her personally if he or she can be found, or, if he or she cannot be found, by leaving a copy at the home of the member with some person of suitable age and discretion. Special meetings may be held without prior written notice when all Council members are present at the meeting or consent thereto in writing. This consent shall be filed with the City Manager-Clerk prior to the beginning of the meeting. Any special meeting attended by all the Council members shall be a valid meeting for the transaction of any business that may come before the meeting. Written notice of any special meeting shall be posted giving the date, time, place and purpose of the meeting at least three days before the meeting. Written notice shall be mailed at least three days before the meeting to anyone who has filed a written request for notice of special meetings. In calculating the three days, if the last day falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the next regular business day shall be counted as the third day.

- (C) All Council meetings, including special meetings and adjourned meetings, shall be open to the public, unless closure is permitted or required by the Open Meeting Law, M.S. Ch. 13D, as it may be amended from time to time.
- (D) No Council meeting shall be conducted after 7:00 p.m. on the day of a political party precinct caucus.

§ 30.16 ANNUAL DESIGNATIONS; OFFICERS, NEWSPAPER, AND DEPOSITORIES.

At the first regular Council meeting in January of each year, the Council shall:

- (A) Designate the official newspaper;

- (C) Choose an acting mayor from the Council members, who shall perform the duties of the Mayor during the disability or absence of the Mayor from the city or, in case of a vacancy in the office of Mayor, until a successor has been appointed and qualified; and
- (D) Appoint officers and employees and members of boards, commissions, and committees as may be necessary.

§ 30.17 PRESIDING OFFICER; MAYOR.

- (A) The Mayor shall preside at all meetings of the Council. In the absence of the Mayor, the acting mayor shall preside. In the absence of both, the City Manager-Clerk shall call the meeting to order and shall preside until the Council members present at the meeting choose one of their number to act temporarily as presiding officer.
- (B) The presiding officer shall preserve order, enforce rules of procedure herein prescribed, and determine without debate, subject to the final decision of the Council on appeal, all questions of procedure and order. Except as otherwise provided by statute or by these rules, the proceedings of the Council shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order Revised.
- (C) Any member may appeal to the Council from a ruling of the presiding officer. If the appeal is seconded, the member may speak once solely on the question involved and the presiding officer may explain his or her ruling, but no other Council member shall participate in the discussion. The appeal shall be sustained if it is approved by a majority of the members present exclusive of the presiding officer.

§ 30.18 MEETING MINUTES.

- (A) (1) Minutes of each Council meeting shall be kept by the City Manager-Clerk, or in his or her absence, by the <u>Assistant City Clerk Deputy City Manager-Clerk</u>. In the absence of both, the presiding officer shall appoint a secretary pro tem.
- (2) Ordinances, resolutions, and claims need not be recorded in full in the minutes if they appear in other permanent records of the City Manager-Clerk and can be accurately identified from the description given in the minutes.
- (B) The minutes of each meeting shall be reduced to typewritten form, and shall be signed by the City Manager-Clerk, and copies thereof shall be delivered to each Council member as soon

as practicable after the meeting. At the next regular Council meeting following delivery, approval of the minutes shall be considered by the Council. The minutes need not be read aloud, but the presiding officer shall call for any additions or corrections. If there is no objection to a proposed addition or correction, approval may be made without a vote of the Council. If there is an objection, the Council shall vote upon the addition or correction. If there are no additions or corrections, the minutes shall stand approved.

- (B) The order of business may be varied by the presiding officer, but all public hearings shall be held at the time specified in the notice of the hearing.
- (C) An agenda of business for each Council meeting shall be prepared and filed in the office of the City Manager-Clerk not later than the Friday immediately preceding the regular scheduled meeting of the City Council. The agenda shall be prepared in accordance with the order of business and copies thereof shall be delivered to each Council member and to the City Attorney as far in advance of the meeting as time for preparation will permit. Unless the Council, in its discretion, votes to consider matters not appearing on the agenda, no item of business shall be considered unless it appears on the agenda for the meeting. In the event any Council member wishes to propose a new ordinance including amendments to existing ordinances, and the new ordinance does not relate directly to a subject or item of business on the agenda, then one week prior to the regular scheduled meeting of the Council, the Council member introducing that ordinance must present to the City Manager-Clerk in writing a summary of the ordinance to be proposed. The City Manager-Clerk shall then include the proposed ordinance as part of the agenda and deliver a copy of the summary to other Council members and to the City Attorney at the same time the agenda is delivered.

§ 30.20 QUORUM; VOTING.

- (A) At all Council meetings a majority of all the Council members elected shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

If any member, being present, does not vote, the minutes, as to his or her name, shall be marked "Present Not voting."
- (C) A majority vote of all members of the Council shall be necessary for approval of any ordinance unless a larger number is required by statute. Except as otherwise provided by statute, a majority vote of a quorum shall prevail in all other cases.
- (D) Whenever a phrase "four-fifths vote of the Council" or a similar phrase is used in this code or any other ordinance contained in the municipal code of the city, these phrases shall be deemed to mean a four-fifths vote of all the members of the Council, including members not then and there present.

§ 30.21 ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS, MOTIONS, AND THE LIKE.

- (A) Every ordinance shall be presented in writing and shall receive two readings by the City Manager-Clerk before the Council previous to its passage, but shall not be read twice at the same meeting unless the rules are suspended for that purpose. Every ordinance introduced or considered shall be recorded in the minutes by title.
- (B) (1) This first reading of an ordinance shall be by title only and unless the rules are suspended, each member of the Council shall be furnished a copy of the ordinance before the next Council meeting. No vote on the first reading will be required except where a public hearing is required before passage of an ordinance.

- (2) In cases where a public hearing is required, the first reading must pass by a majority vote of the Council members then and there present before a public hearing will be called, and if the ordinance shall fail to receive a majority vote to pass in the first reading, no public hearing will be called and the ordinance shall be deemed to have been defeated. A vote in favor of the passage of the first reading of the ordinance shall not be deemed a vote in favor of the ordinance on the second reading, nor shall a Council member voting for an approval of the first reading be required to vote in favor of the ordinance on the second reading. Nothing in this section shall be construed to deny the right to a public hearing where a citizen has a right to a hearing under law. The first reading of an ordinance shall be informational in nature only and unless the rules are suspended shall not be subject to debate at the first reading.
- (C) The second reading of an ordinance shall be by section headings only, at which time amendments, if any, may be offered; but the reading of any sections shall not prevent a Council member from offering amendments to a previous section. If no amendments are made, the presiding officer shall submit the ordinance to a vote; but if amendments are made, the presiding officer shall so report and each section shall be read as amended before a vote upon the ordinance is taken.
- (D) All motions shall be recorded in the minutes and stated in full before the presiding officer submits them to a vote. All petitions and other communications addressed to the Council shall be in writing and shall be read in full upon presentation of the same to the Council. They shall then be filed in the office of the City Manager-Clerk.
- (E) Every ordinance and resolution by the Council shall be signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Manager-Clerk, and filed by him or her in the Ordinance or Resolution Book. Proof of publication of every ordinance shall be attached to and filed with the ordinance.
- (F) Every ordinance or resolution repealing a previous ordinance or resolution or a section or division thereof shall give the number, if any, and the title of the ordinance or resolution to be repealed in whole or in part. No ordinance or resolution or division thereof shall be amended by reference to the title alone, but the amending ordinance or resolution shall set forth in full each section or division to be amended.

§ 31.01 RESERVED

FIRE DEPARTMENT

§ 31.20 CONTINUATION OF DEPARTMENT.

There is hereby continued in this city a Volunteer Fire Department consisting of a Chief(s) and other officers as the City Manager or City Council shall establish, and a number of firefighters as may be determined from time to time by the City Manager, but shall not be greater than 25. (Ord. passed 1-19-89; Am. Ord. 406, passed 12-19-13)

§ 31.21 FIREFIGHTER APPOINTMENT.

- (A) The officers on the department shall be selected annually by the Chief from an eligibility list subject to confirmation by the City Manager-Clerk following consultation with the City Council. Each shall hold office for one year and until his or her successor has been duly qualified and appointed, except that an officer may be removed by the City Manager-Clerk for cause.
- (B) Firefighters and probationary firefighters shall be appointed or removed by the City Manager-Clerk, who shall take into consideration recommendations of the Department officers and members of the Department.

§ 31.22 DUTIES OF CHIEF.

- (A) The Chief(s) shall have control of the firefighting apparatus and shall be solely responsible for its care and condition. He or she shall make an annual report to the Council at its meeting in June of each year on the condition of the equipment and needs of the Fire Department.
- (B) He or she may submit additional reports and recommendations at any meeting of the Council, and shall report each suspension by him or her of a member of the Fire Department to the City Manager-Clerk as soon as reasonably practicable following the suspension.
- (C) The Chief(s) shall be responsible for the proper training of Firefighters. The City Manager may discipline or suspend any member for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for violating Fire Department organization rules and regulations.

§ 31.23 RECORDS.

The Chief shall keep in convenient form a complete record of all fires. The record shall include the time of the alarm, location of fire, cause of fire (if known), type of building, name of owner and tenant, purpose for which occupied, value of building and contents, members of the Department responding to the alarm, and other information as he or she may deem advisable or as may be required from time to time by the City Manager-Clerk or the State Department of Commerce.

§ 31.24 REGULATIONS.

The Department may enact a department policy manual for its regulation as shall be necessary from time to time, all of which shall be subject to confirmation by the Council. All these regulations shall comply with all ordinances of this city as well as with all laws of the state, specifically including, but not by way of limitation, compliance with the State Human Rights Act (M.S. §§ 363.01 through 363.14, as amended from time to time), and comply with applicable federal laws.

§ 31.40 ESTABLISHMENT.

The Planning Commission for this municipality is hereby continued as heretofore established. (74 Code, § 220:00)

§ 31.41 COMPOSITION.

- (A) The Planning Commission shall consist of seven voting members. A minimum of five members shall be appointed from the resident population of the city and up to two members may be appointed from the surrounding community area. Any member may be removed by a majority vote of the Council.
- (B) In addition to the seven members, the Council shall select one member for the Commission from among its own members to serve as a Planning Commission liaison. The Council member, City Manager-Clerk, City Attorney, and the City Zoning Administrator shall all be ex-officio members.

§ 31.42 LENGTH OF APPOINTMENT.

The terms of ex-officio members shall correspond to their respective official tenures. Vacancies during the term shall be filled by the Council for the unexpired portion of the term. Every appointed member shall, before entering upon the discharge of his or her duties, take an oath that he or she will faithfully discharge the duties of the office. All members, excluding ex-officio members, of the Planning Commission shall receive a monthly stipend as set by ordinance to help defray their expenses.
- (B) All current appointments shall expire on December 31, 2007, and initial appointments under this ordinance shall be made on January 1, 2008 as follows: Two seats for one-year terms, two seats for two-year terms, and three seats for three-year terms. All appointments made after the initial appointment shall convert to three-year terms. (Ord. 367, passed 2-15-07)

§ 31.43 OFFICERS; MEETINGS AND RECORDS.

The Commission shall elect a Chairperson from among its appointed members for a term of one year, and the Commission may create and fill other offices as it may determine. The Commission shall hold at least one regular meeting each month meet as needed. It shall adopt rules for the transaction of business and shall keep a record of its resolutions, transactions, and findings, which record shall be a public record. On or before January 1 of each year the Commission shall submit to the Council a report of its work during the preceding year. Expenditures of the Commission shall be within amounts appropriated for the purpose by the Council.

§ 31.44 PROGRAM OF WORK.

- (A) Upon the appointment and organization of the Commission, it shall proceed with the preparation and adoption of resolution of a program of work, outlining activities proposed to be undertaken in the exercise of its powers and the performance of its duties. The program will include:
- (1) An outline of data and information to be assembled as a basis for the Comprehensive Plan:
 - (2) An outline of subjects to be covered by the Comprehensive Plan; and
 - (3) An outline of types of procedure necessary to make the Comprehensive Plan effective.
- (B) The Planning Commission may, by resolution, revise its program of work from time to time.

§ 31.45 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN; PREPARATION.

It shall be the function and duty of the Planning Commission to prepare and recommend to the Council a Comprehensive Plan for the physical development of this municipality, including proposed public buildings, street arrangements and improvements, public utility services, parks,

playgrounds, and other similar developments, the use of property, the density of population, and other matters relating to its physical development. The Plan may be prepared in sections, each of which shall relate to a major subject of the Plan, as outlined in the Commission's program of work.

§ 31.46 PROCEDURE FOR ADOPTION OF PLAN.

- (A) Before recommending to the Council for adoption the Comprehensive Plan or any section of it or any substantial amendment thereof, the Commission shall hold at least one public hearing thereon, notice of the time and place of which shall be given by publication in a newspaper of general circulation at least ten days before the day of the hearing. The Council may amend and adopt the recommended Plan by a two-thirds vote for all its members.
- (B) The Commission may from time to time recommend to the Council amendments or deletions to the Plan or section thereof as herein provided for the adoption of the original plan whenever changed conditions or further studies by the Commission indicate that an amendment or addition is necessary.

§ 31.47 EXECUTION OF PLAN.

- (A) Upon the adoption of the Comprehensive Plan or any section thereof, it shall be the duty of the Planning Commission to recommend to the Council reasonable and practicable means for putting into effect the Plan or section thereof in order that the same will serve as a pattern and guide for the orderly physical development of this municipality and as a basis for the efficient expenditure of the funds thereof relating to the subjects of the Plan.
- (B) These means shall consist of any proposed revision of the current existing zoning plan, the control of subdivision plats, a plan of future streets, coordination of the normal public improvements, a long-term program of capital expenditures, and other matters as will accomplish the purposes of this section.

PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY COMMISSION

§ 31.75 ESTABLISHMENT; MEMBERSHIP.

There is hereby established a Parks and Recreation Commission for the city, pursuant to M.S. § 412.11, as amended from time to time. The Commission shall consist of nine voting members, who shall be appointed by the City Council, with names of candidates submitted 30 days prior to selection at January's regular Council meeting. The term of each member shall be three years. Vacancies during the term shall be filled by the Council for the unexpired portion of the term. There is no limit to the number of times of service, but reappointments are not to be automatic. A City Council member shall be appointed by the City Council as a liaison and shall serve as an exofficio member of the Commission. All members, excluding ex-officio members, of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission shall receive a monthly stipend for meetings attended, in an amount set by ordinance, to help-defray their expenses.

§ 31.76 MEETINGS; RULES OF PROCEDURE; OFFICERS.

The Commission shall hold at least one regular meeting each month meet as needed. The Commission shall establish rules of procedure as may be deemed necessary. The Commission shall select a Chairperson and a Secretary from its membership who shall serve for terms of one year, beginning with the first meeting of the year.

ORDINANCE NO. 496

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING AND ADOPTING A SUPPLEMENT TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF MILACA, MN

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, Ohio, has completed the S-18 Supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the Political Subdivision, which supplement contains all ordinances of a general and permanent nature enacted since the prior supplement to the Code of Ordinances of this Political Subdivision; and

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation has recommended the revision or addition of certain sections of the Code of Ordinances which are based on or make reference to sections of the Minnesota code; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the city council to accept these updated sections in accordance with the changes of the law of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide for the usual daily operation of the municipality and for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the municipality that this ordinance take effect at an early date;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF MILACA:

Section 1. That the 2022 S-18 Supplement to the Code of Ordinance of the City of Milaca as submitted by American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, Ohio, and as attached hereto, be and the same is hereby adopted by reference as if set out in its entirety.

Section 2. Such supplement shall be deemed published as of the day of its adoption and approval by the Milaca City Council, and the City Manager is hereby authorized and ordered to insert such supplement into the copy of the Code of Ordinances kept on file in the Office of the City Manager.

Section 3. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, safety and general welfare of the people of this municipality, and shall take effect at the earliest date provided by law.

INSURANCE/WORKERS' COMPENSATION

COVID-19 presumption extension

Chapter 32 (HF 1203*/SF 1203) reinstates as of Feb. 3, 2022, the COVID-19 workers' compensation occupational disease presumption for public safety and health care personnel who contract COVID-19. The presumption sunsets Jan. 13, 2023. The law clarifies that employees with dates of injury that occurred after Dec. 31, 2021 (the sunset of the former law) and before Feb. 3 or after the sunset of the re-enacted presumption on Jan. 13, 2023, are not precluded from claiming an occupational disease as a result of contracting COVID-19. However, without the occupational disease presumption, the burden of proof would be on the employee to demonstrate a work-related cause. Effective Feb. 3, 2022, through Jan. 13, 2023. (GC)



Intermediate care facilities as temporary permitted single-family residential use

Chapter 98 (*HF 4065/SF 3816) is the omnibus health and human services policy bill. Article 4, section 11 amends Minn. Stat. § 245A.11, subd. 2 to temporarily allow licensed residential services provided to more than four persons with developmental disabilities in a supervised living facility with a licensed capacity of seven to eight persons as a permitted single-family residential use, unless otherwise provided in a zoning regulation. A zoning authority may require a conditional use or special use permit to assure proper maintenance and operation of the residential program. Conditions imposed on the residential program must not be more restrictive than those imposed on other conditional uses or special uses of residential property in the same zones, unless the additional conditions are necessary to protect the health and safety of the persons being served by the program. Effective July 1, 2022, and expires on July 1, 2023. (IK)



LIQUOR

Liquor licensing changes

Chapter 86 (HF 2767/SF 3008*) is the omnibus liquor bill. It modifies provisions relating to liquor regulation and authorizes special local liquor laws. Effective May 23, 2022. (AH)

Article 1: Liquor regulation

 Distiller license changes. Article 1, section 1 amends Minn. Stat. § 340.101 to allow a municipality to issue a cocktail room license to the holder of a distilled spirits manufacturer license. This authorizes on-sale of distilled liquor produced by the distiller for consumption on the premises of or adjacent to one distillery location owned by the distiller. Under this new authorization, a municipality must notify the commissioner of the Department of Public Safety within 10 days of issuance or of any adverse action involving the licenses, just as it would a microdistillery cocktail room license. This provision also changes the amount for cities' microdistillery off-sale licenses from 375 milliliters to up to750 milliliters per customer per day in any size container or combination of approved containers.

- Growler sales expanded to larger breweries. Article 1, section 4 amends Minn. Stat. § 340A.28, subd. 2 to increase the number of barrels a brewer could produce annually to sell 750 of those barrels in growlers from 20,000 barrels annually to 150,000 barrels.
- Small brewer off-sale of 128 ounces. Article 1, section 5 creates Minn. Stat. § 340A.29 to allow a brewer licensed under Minn. Stat. § 340A.301 that produces 7,500 barrels or less of malt liquor annually to be issued a license by a municipality for off-sale of up to 128 ounces per customer per day in any packaging conforming to state and federal regulation.
- Expanding authorized establishments to receive on-sale licenses. Article 1, section 10 amends Minn. Stat. § 340A.404, subd. 1 to allow a city to issue on-sale intoxicating liquor licenses to "resorts," as defined in Minn. Stat. § 157.15, subd. 11. The change also allows a municipality to issue an on-sale wine and an on-sale malt liquor license to a baseball team competing in a league established by the Minnesota Baseball Association, or to a person holding a concessions or management contract for beverage sales at a ballpark for the purposes of summer town ball games.
- Eliminates 30-day temporary license restriction. Article 1, section 14 removes the restriction in Minn. Stat. § 340A.410, subd. 10 that a municipality may not issue more than one temporary license under Minn. Stat. § 340A.404, subd. 10 to any one organization or registered political committee, or for any one location, within any 30-day period.
- Seven-day temporary license for county fairs.

 Article 1, section 14 allows a municipality to issue one seven-day temporary license per year to a county agricultural society established under Minn. Stat. § 38.01 for alcoholic beverage sales at a county fair.
- Expanded hours for FIFA World Cup. Article 1, section 16 authorizes a licensing jurisdiction to issue special permits for service of alcohol during extended hours. The permit authorizes the sale of alcoholic beverages 30 minutes before, during, and 30 minutes after a scheduled broadcast of a live World Cup match. Only holders of an existing on-sale intoxicating liquor license or 3.2% malt liquor license are eligible for the extended hours. This new authorization expires on Sept. 1, 2023.

Article 2: Special local liquor laws

- Willmar on-sale licensing. Article 2, section 1 authorizes the City of Wilmar to issue an on-sale wine license and an on-sale malt liquor license to a person who is the owner of a junior league hockey team or to a person holding a concessions or management contract with the city or the team owner for beverage sales at Willmar Civic Center.
- Sauk Rapids on-sale licensing. Article 2, section 1 authorizes the City of Sauk Rapids to issue an on-sale intoxicating liquor license to an entity holding a management or concessions contract with the city for operation within Bob Cross Regional Park and for an entity holding a concessions or management contract with the city for operation of a regional event center located within Lions Park or Southside Park.
- St. Paul license. Article 2, section 3 authorizes the City of St. Paul to issue a temporary on-sale malt liquor license to the Thai Cultural Council of Minnesota for both days of the Minnesota Songkran Festival on the grounds of the state Capitol.
- St. Cloud on-sale licensing. Article 2, section 4 authorizes the City of St. Cloud to issue an on-sale wine license and an on-sale malt liquor license to the city recreation facility Whitney Recreation.
- Anoka special license. Article 2, section 5 authorizes the City of Anoka to issue a social district license to any holder of an on-sale license whose on-sale premises is contiguous with the premises of the social district designated by the city. The authorization requires that the City of Anoka clearly defines the boundaries of the social district, days, and times during which alcoholic beverages may be consumed and establish management and maintenance plans for the social district. The City of Anoka must provide a report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over liquor registration within 24 months from the first issuance of a social district license.
- Rochester on-sale licensing. Article 2, section 6 authorizes the City of Rochester to issue an on-sale wine license and an on-sale malt liquor license to a person who is the owner of a junior league hockey team or to a person holding a concessions or management contract with the city or the team owner for beverage sales at the Runestone Community Center.



Bloomington Housing and Redevelopment Authority clarification

Chapter 60 (HF 3834*/SF 3564) clarifies that the Bloomington Housing and Redevelopment Authority is subject to the housing and redevelopment authority provisions in Minn. Stat. ch. 469 and deletes references to sections of law that were repealed in 1987. Effective the day after the city of Bloomington complies with requirements of Minn. Stat. § 645.021. (DL)



PENSIONS

Retirement annuity for reemployed health care and long-term care workers

Chapter 34 (HF 3136/SF 2957) amends and extends 2020 Laws, chapter 79, article 5, section 1, the 2020 law that was enacted to encourage retired health care workers and longterm care workers to return to work or allow other nearretirement workers to continue to work without regard to existing statutory pension limitations on earnings or hours or percentage of time worked. Under the chapter, health care workers and long-term care workers, including those who provide operational support in a direct patient care environment, and who are receiving a retirement annuity from a Public Employees Retirement Association or Minnesota State Retirement System pension plan are able to receive their full retirement annuity, without reduction or suspension, upon reemployment or continued employment after retirement or under a phased retirement agreement. The chapter also corrects language in the original 2020 law to ensure that health care workers who did not meet the technical requirements of the session law, including those in phased-retirement agreements, will not be required to repay their annuity. Effective March 5, 2022 and expires Dec. 31, 2023. (GC)

Omnibus pension policy bill

Chapter 65 (HF 4017/SF 3540*) is the 2022 omnibus pension policy bill. Note: The Legislative Commission on Pensions and Retirement also recommended a pensions finance bill (HF 4016/SF 3541*); however, that bill was not approved by the House or the Senate. Below is a summary of provisions that impact cities. Effective dates vary and are noted below. (GC/AF)

• Duluth Transit Authority. Article 2, sections 1 and 4 address the retirement benefits of employees of the Duluth Transit Authority (DTA), which is moving from a contracting model for services to being the employer. The DTA is in the process of acquiring that company and that acquisition will cause the new employees to

State of Minnesota Joint Powers Agreement

This Agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Department of Public Safety on behalf of the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension ("BCA"), and the City of Milaca on behalf of its Prosecuting Attorney ("Governmental Unit"). The BCA and the Governmental Unit may be referred to jointly as "Parties."

Recitals

Under Minn. Stat. § 471.59, the BCA and the Governmental Unit are empowered to engage in agreements that are necessary to exercise their powers. Under Minn. Stat. § 299C.46, the BCA must provide a criminal justice data communications network to benefit political subdivisions as defined under Minn. Stat. § 299C.46, subd. 2 and subd. 2(a). The Governmental Unit is authorized by law to utilize the criminal justice data communications network pursuant to the terms set out in this Agreement. In addition, BCA either maintains repositories of data or has access to repositories of data that benefit authorized political subdivisions in performing their duties. The Governmental Unit wants to access data in support of its official duties.

The purpose of this Agreement is to create a method by which the Governmental Unit has access to those systems and tools for which it has eligibility, and to memorialize the requirements to obtain access and the limitations on the access.

Agreement

1 Term of Agreement

- 1.1 Effective Date. This Agreement is effective on the date the BCA obtains all required signatures under Minn. Stat. § 16C.05, subdivision 2.
- **1.2** Expiration Date. This Agreement expires five years from the date it is effective.

2 Agreement Between the Parties

2.1 General Access. BCA agrees to provide Governmental Unit with access to the Minnesota Criminal Justice Data Communications Network (CJDN) and those systems and tools which the Governmental Unit is authorized by law to access via the CJDN for the purposes outlined in Minn. Stat. § 299C.46.

2.2 Methods of Access.

The BCA offers three (3) methods of access to its systems and tools. The methods of access are:

- A. **Direct access** occurs when individual users at the Governmental Unit use the Governmental Unit's equipment to access the BCA's systems and tools. This is generally accomplished by an individual user entering a query into one of BCA's systems or tools.
- B. Indirect Access occurs when individual users at the Governmental Unit go to another Governmental Unit to obtain data and information from BCA's systems and tools. This method of access generally results in the Governmental Unit with indirect access obtaining the needed data and information in a physical format like a paper report.
- Computer-to-Computer System Interface occurs when the Governmental Unit's computer exchanges data and information with BCA's computer systems and tools using an interface. Without limitation, interface types include: state message switch, web services, enterprise service bus and message queuing.

For purposes of this Agreement, Governmental Unit employees or contractors may use any of these methods to use BCA's systems and tools as described in this Agreement. Governmental Unit will select a

- method of access and can change the methodology following the process in Clause 2.10.
- **2.3** Federal Systems Access. In addition, pursuant to 28 CFR §20.30-38 and Minn. Stat. §299C.58, BCA may provide Governmental Unit with access to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) National Crime Information Center.
- 2.4 Governmental Unit Policies. Both the BCA and the FBI's Criminal Justice Information Systems (FBI-CJIS) have policies, regulations and laws on access, use, audit, dissemination, hit confirmation, logging, quality assurance, screening (pre-employment), security, timeliness, training, use of the system, and validation. Governmental Unit has created its own policies to ensure that Governmental Unit's employees and contractors comply with all applicable requirements. Governmental Unit ensures this compliance through appropriate enforcement. These BCA and FBI-CJIS policies and regulations, as amended and updated from time to time, are incorporated into this Agreement by reference. The policies are available at https://bcanextest.x.state.mn.us/launchpad/.
- 2.5 Governmental Unit Resources. To assist Governmental Unit in complying with the federal and state requirements on access to and use of the various systems and tools, information is available at https://sps.x.state.mn.us/sites/bcaservicecatalog/default.aspx. Additional information on appropriate use is found in the Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension Policy on Appropriate Use of Systems and Data available at https://bcanextest.x.state.mn.us/launchpad/cjisdocs/docs.cgi?cmd=FS&ID=795&TYPE=DOCS.

2.6 Access Granted.

- A. Governmental Unit is granted permission to use all current and future BCA systems and tools for which Governmental Unit is eligible. Eligibility is dependent on Governmental Unit (i) satisfying all applicable federal or state statutory requirements; (ii) complying with the terms of this Agreement; and (iii) acceptance by BCA of Governmental Unit's written request for use of a specific system or tool.
- B. To facilitate changes in systems and tools, Governmental Unit grants its Authorized Representative authority to make written requests for those systems and tools provided by BCA that the Governmental Unit needs to meet its criminal justice obligations and for which Governmental Unit is eligible.
- 2.7 Future Access. On written request from the Governmental Unit, BCA also may provide Governmental Unit with access to those systems or tools which may become available after the signing of this Agreement, to the extent that the access is authorized by applicable state and federal law. Governmental Unit agrees to be bound by the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement that when utilizing new systems or tools provided under this Agreement.
- 2.8 Limitations on Access. BCA agrees that it will comply with applicable state and federal laws when making information accessible. Governmental Unit agrees that it will comply with applicable state and federal laws when accessing, entering, using, disseminating, and storing data. Each party is responsible for its own compliance with the most current applicable state and federal laws.
- 2.9 Supersedes Prior Agreements. This Agreement supersedes any and all prior agreements between the BCA and the Governmental Unit regarding access to and use of systems and tools provided by BCA.
- 2.10 Requirement to Update Information. The parties agree that if there is a change to any of the information whether required by law or this Agreement, the party will send the new information to the other party in writing within 30 days of the change. This clause does not apply to changes in systems or tools provided under this Agreement.
 - This requirement to give notice additionally applies to changes in the individual or organization serving the Governmental Unit as its prosecutor. Any change in performance of the prosecutorial function must be provided to the BCA in writing by giving notice to the Service Desk, BCA.ServiceDesk@state.mn.us.
- 2.11 Transaction Record. The BCA creates and maintains a transaction record for each exchange of data utilizing its systems and tools. In order to meet FBI-CJIS requirements and to perform the audits described in Clause 7, there must be a method of identifying which individual users at the Governmental Unit conducted a

particular transaction.

If Governmental Unit uses either direct access as described in Clause 2.2A or indirect access as described in Clause 2.2B, BCA's transaction record meets FBI-CJIS requirements.

When Governmental Unit's method of access is a computer-to-computer interface as described in Clause 2.2C, the Governmental Unit must keep a transaction record sufficient to satisfy FBI-CJIS requirements and permit the audits described in Clause 7 to occur.

If a Governmental Unit accesses data from the Driver and Vehicle Services Division in the Minnesota Department of Public Safety and keeps a copy of the data, Governmental Unit must have a transaction record of all subsequent access to the data that are kept by the Governmental Unit. The transaction record must include the individual user who requested access, and the date, time and content of the request. The transaction record must also include the date, time and content of the response along with the destination to which the data were sent. The transaction record must be maintained for a minimum of six (6) years from the date the transaction occurred and must be made available to the BCA within one (1) business day of the BCA's request.

- 2.12 Court Information Access. Certain BCA systems and tools that include access to and/or submission of Court Records may only be utilized by the Governmental Unit if the Governmental Unit completes the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment, which upon execution will be incorporated into this Agreement by reference. These BCA systems and tools are identified in the written request made by the Governmental Unit under Clause 2.6 above. The Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment provides important additional terms, including but not limited to privacy (see Clause 8.2, below), fees (see Clause 3 below), and transaction records or logs, that govern Governmental Unit's access to and/or submission of the Court Records delivered through the BCA systems and tools.
- 2.13 Vendor Personnel Screening. The BCA will conduct all vendor personnel screening on behalf of Governmental Unit as is required by the FBI CJIS Security Policy. The BCA will maintain records of the federal, fingerprint-based background check on each vendor employee as well as records of the completion of the security awareness training that may be relied on by the Governmental Unit.

3 Payment

The Governmental Unit understands there is a cost for access to the criminal justice data communications network described in Minn. Stat. § 299C.46. At the time this Agreement is signed, BCA understands that a third party will be responsible for the cost of access.

The Governmental Unit will identify the third party and provide the BCA with the contact information and its contact person for billing purposes so that billing can be established. The Governmental Unit will provide updated information to BCA's Authorized Representative within ten business days when this information changes.

If Governmental Unit chooses to execute the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment referred to in Clause 2.12 in order to access and/or submit Court Records via BCA's systems, additional fees, if any, are addressed in that amendment.

5 Assignment, Amendments, Waiver, and Agreement Complete

- 5.1 Assignment. Neither party may assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this Agreement.
- **5.2** Amendments. Any amendment to this Agreement, except those described in Clauses 2.6 and 2.7 above must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been signed and approved by the same parties who signed and approved the original agreement, their successors in office, or another individual duly authorized.
- **5.3 Waiver.** If either party fails to enforce any provision of this Agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the right to enforce it.
- **5.4** Agreement Complete. This Agreement contains all negotiations and agreements between the BCA and the Governmental Unit. No other understanding regarding this Agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

6 Liability

Each party will be responsible for its own acts and behavior and the results thereof and shall not be responsible or liable for the other party's actions and consequences of those actions. The Minnesota Torts Claims Act, Minn. Stat. § 3.736 and other applicable laws govern the BCA's liability. The Minnesota Municipal Tort Claims Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 466 and other applicable laws, governs the Governmental Unit's liability.

7 Audits

- 7.1 Under Minn. Stat. § 16C.05, subd. 5, the Governmental Unit's books, records, documents, internal policies and accounting procedures and practices relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by the BCA, the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this Agreement.
 - Under Minn. Stat. § 6.551, the State Auditor may examine the books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of BCA. The examination shall be limited to the books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices that are relevant to this Agreement.
- 7.2 Under applicable state and federal law, the Governmental Unit's records are subject to examination by the BCA to ensure compliance with laws, regulations and policies about access, use, and dissemination of data.
- 7.3 If the Governmental Unit accesses federal databases, the Governmental Unit's records are subject to examination by the FBI and BCA; the Governmental Unit will cooperate with FBI and BCA auditors and make any requested data available for review and audit.
- 7.4 If the Governmental Unit accesses state databases, the Governmental Unit's records are subject to examination by the BCA: the Governmental Unit will cooperate with the BCA auditors and make any requested data available for review and audit.

7.5 To facilitate the audits required by state and federal law, Governmental Unit is required to have an inventory of the equipment used to access the data covered by this Agreement and the physical location of each.

8 Government Data Practices

- 8.1 BCA and Governmental Unit. The Governmental Unit and BCA must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13, as it applies to all data accessible under this Agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the Governmental Unit under this Agreement. The remedies of Minn. Stat. §§ 13.08 and 13.09 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the Governmental Unit or the BCA.
- 8.2 Court Records. If Governmental Unit chooses to execute the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment referred to in Clause 2.12 in order to access and/or submit Court Records via BCA's systems, the following provisions regarding data practices also apply. The Court is not subject to Minn. Stat. Ch. 13 but is subject to the Rules of Public Access to Records of the Judicial Branch promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court. All parties acknowledge and agree that Minn. Stat. § 13.03, subdivision 4(e) requires that the BCA and the Governmental Unit comply with the Rules of Public Access for those data received from Court under the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment. All parties also acknowledge and agree that the use of, access to or submission of Court Records, as that term is defined in the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment, may be restricted by rules promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court, applicable state statute or federal law. All parties acknowledge and agree that these applicable restrictions must be followed in the appropriate circumstances.

9 Investigation of Alleged Violations; Sanctions

For purposes of this clause, "Individual User" means an employee or contractor of Governmental Unit.

prosecution. The Governmental Unit and BCA agree to cooperate in the investigation and possible prosecution of suspected violations of federal and state law referenced in this Agreement. Governmental Unit and BCA agree to cooperate in the investigation of suspected violations of the policies and procedures referenced in this Agreement. When BCA becomes aware that a violation may have occurred, BCA will inform Governmental Unit of the suspected violation, subject to any restrictions in applicable law. When Governmental Unit becomes aware that a violation has occurred, Governmental Unit will inform BCA subject to any restrictions in applicable law.

9.2 Sanctions Involving Only BCA Systems and Tools.

The following provisions apply to BCA systems and tools not covered by the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment. None of these provisions alter the Governmental Unit internal discipline processes, including those governed by a collective bargaining agreement.

- 9.2.1 For BCA systems and tools that are not covered by the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment, Governmental Unit must determine if and when an involved Individual User's access to systems or tools is to be temporarily or permanently eliminated. The decision to suspend or terminate access may be made as soon as alleged violation is discovered, after notice of an alleged violation is received, or after an investigation has occurred. Governmental Unit must report the status of the Individual User's access to BCA without delay. BCA reserves the right to make a different determination concerning an Individual User's access to systems or tools than that made by Governmental Unit and BCA's determination controls.
- 9.2.2 If BCA determines that Governmental Unit has jeopardized the integrity of the systems or tools covered in this Clause 9.2, BCA may temporarily stop providing some or all the systems or tools under this Agreement until the failure is remedied to the BCA's satisfaction. If Governmental Unit's failure is continuing or repeated, Clause 11.1 does not apply and BCA may terminate this Agreement immediately.

9.3 Sanctions Involving Only Court Data Services

The following provisions apply to those systems and tools covered by the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment, if it has been signed by Governmental Unit. As part of the agreement between the Court and the BCA for the delivery of the systems and tools that are covered by the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment, BCA is required to suspend or terminate access to or use of the systems and tools either on its own initiative or when directed by the Court. The decision to suspend or terminate access may be made as soon as an alleged violation is discovered, after notice of an alleged violation is received, or after an investigation has occurred. The decision to suspend or terminate may also be made based on a request from the Authorized Representative of Governmental Unit. The agreement further provides that only the Court has the authority to reinstate access and use.

- 9.3.1 Governmental Unit understands that if it has signed the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment and if Governmental Unit's Individual Users violate the provisions of that Amendment, access and use will be suspended by BCA or Court. Governmental Unit also understands that reinstatement is only at the direction of the Court.
- 9.3.2 Governmental Unit further agrees that if Governmental Unit believes that one or more of its Individual Users have violated the terms of the Amendment, it will notify BCA and Court so that an investigation as described in Clause 9.1 may occur.

10 Venue

Venue for all legal proceedings involving this Agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

11 Termination

- **11.1 Termination.** The BCA or the Governmental Unit may terminate this Agreement at any time, with or without cause, upon 30 days' written notice to the other party's Authorized Representative.
- 11.2 Termination for Insufficient Funding. Either party may immediately terminate this Agreement if it does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source; or if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the payment of the services covered here. Termination must be by written notice to the other party's authorized representative. The Governmental Unit is not obligated to pay for any services that are provided after notice and effective date of termination. However, the BCA will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed to the extent that funds are available. Neither party will be assessed any penalty if the agreement is terminated because of the decision of the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source, not to appropriate funds. Notice of the lack of funding must be provided within a reasonable time of the affected party receiving that notice.

12 Continuing Obligations

The following clauses survive the expiration or cancellation of this Agreement: Liability; Audits; Government Data Practices; 9. Investigation of Alleged Violations; Sanctions; and Venue.

COURT DATA SERVICES SUBSCRIBER AMENDMENT TO CJDN SUBSCRIBER AGREEMENT

This Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment ("Subscriber Amendment") is entered into by the State of Minnesota, acting through its Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Criminal Apprehension, ("BCA") and the City of Milaca on behalf of its Prosecuting Attorney ("Agency"), and by and for the benefit of the State of Minnesota acting through its State Court Administrator's Office ("Court") who shall be entitled to enforce any provisions hereof through any legal action against any party.

Recitals

This Subscriber Amendment modifies and supplements the Agreement between the BCA and Agency, SWIFT Contract number 202861, of even or prior date, for Agency use of BCA systems and tools (referred to herein as "the CJDN Subscriber Agreement"). Certain BCA systems and tools that include access to and/or submission of Court Records may only be utilized by the Agency if the Agency completes this Subscriber Amendment. The Agency desires to use one or more BCA systems and tools to access and/or submit Court Records to assist the Agency in the efficient performance of its duties as required or authorized by law or court rule. Court desires to permit such access and/or submission. This Subscriber Amendment is intended to add Court as a party to the CJDN Subscriber Agreement and to create obligations by the Agency to the Court that can be enforced by the Court. It is also understood that, pursuant to the Master Joint Powers Agreement for Delivery of Court Data Services to CJDN Subscribers ("Master Authorization Agreement") between the Court and the BCA, the BCA is authorized to sign this Subscriber Amendment on behalf of Court. Upon execution the Subscriber Amendment will be incorporated into the CJDN The BCA, the Agency and the Court desire to amend the Subscriber Agreement by reference. CJDN Subscriber Agreement as stated below.

The CJDN Subscriber Agreement is amended by the addition of the following provisions:

- Amendment shall be effective on the date finally executed by all parties and shall remain in effect until expiration or termination of the CJDN Subscriber Agreement unless terminated earlier as provided in this Subscriber Amendment. Any party may terminate this Subscriber Amendment with or without cause by giving written notice to all other parties. The effective date of the termination shall be thirty days after the other party's receipt of the notice of termination, unless a later date is specified in the notice. The provisions of sections 5 through 9, 12.b., 12.c., and 15 through 24 shall survive any termination of this Subscriber Amendment as shall any other provisions which by their nature are intended or expected to survive such termination. Upon termination, the Subscriber shall perform the responsibilities set forth in paragraph 7(f) hereof.
- 2. **Definitions**. Unless otherwise specifically defined, each term used herein shall have the meaning assigned to such term in the CJDN Subscriber Agreement.

- a. "Authorized Court Data Services" means Court Data Services that have been authorized for delivery to CJDN Subscribers via BCA systems and tools pursuant to an Authorization Amendment to the Joint Powers Agreement for Delivery of Court Data Services to CJDN Subscribers ("Master Authorization Agreement") between the Court and the BCA.
- b. "Court Data Services" means one or more of the services set forth on the Justice Agency Resource webpage of the Minnesota Judicial Branch website (for which the current address is www.courts.state.mn.us) or other location designated by the Court, as the same may be amended from time to time by the Court.
- c. "Court Records" means all information in any form made available by the Court to Subscriber through the BCA for the purposes of carrying out this Subscriber Amendment, including:
 - i. "Court Case Information" means any information in the Court Records that conveys information about a particular case or controversy, including without limitation Court Confidential Case Information, as defined herein.
 - ii. "Court Confidential Case Information" means any information in the Court Records that is inaccessible to the public pursuant to the Rules of Public Access and that conveys information about a particular case or controversy.
 - iii. "Court Confidential Security and Activation Information" means any information in the Court Records that is inaccessible to the public pursuant to the Rules of Public Access and that explains how to use or gain access to Court Data Services, including but not limited to login account names, passwords, TCP/IP addresses, Court Data Services user manuals, Court Data Services Programs, Court Data Services Databases, and other technical information.
 - iv. "Court Confidential Information" means any information in the Court Records that is inaccessible to the public pursuant to the Rules of Public Access, including without limitation both i) Court Confidential Case Information; and ii) Court Confidential Security and Activation Information.
- d. "DCA" shall mean the district courts of the state of Minnesota and their respective staff.
- e. "Policies & Notices" means the policies and notices published by the Court in connection with each of its Court Data Services, on a website or other location designated by the Court, as the same may be amended from time to time by the Court. Policies & Notices for each Authorized Court Data Service identified in an approved request form under section 3, below, are hereby made part of this Subscriber Amendment by this reference and provide additional terms and conditions that govern Subscriber's use of Court Records accessed through such services, including but not limited to provisions on access and use limitations.

- f. "Rules of Public Access" means the Rules of Public Access to Records of the Judicial Branch promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court, as the same may be amended from time to time, including without limitation lists or tables published from time to time by the Court entitled Limits on Public Access to Case Records or Limits on Public Access to Administrative Records, all of which by this reference are made a part of this Subscriber Amendment. It is the obligation of Subscriber to check from time to time for updated rules, lists, and tables and be familiar with the contents thereof. It is contemplated that such rules, lists, and tables will be posted on the Minnesota Judicial Branch website, for which the current address is www.courts.state.mn.us.
- g. "Court" shall mean the State of Minnesota, State Court Administrator's Office.
 - h. "Subscriber" shall mean the Agency.
- i. "Subscriber Records" means any information in any form made available by the Subscriber to the Court for the purposes of carrying out this Subscriber Amendment.
- 3. REQUESTS FOR AUTHORIZED COURT DATA SERVICES. Following execution of this Subscriber Amendment by all parties, Subscriber may submit to the BCA one or more separate requests for Authorized Court Data Services. The BCA is authorized in the Master Authorization Agreement to process, credential and approve such requests on behalf of Court and all such requests approved by the BCA are adopted and incorporated herein by this reference the same as if set forth verbatim herein.
 - a. Activation. Activation of the requested Authorized Court Data Service(s) shall occur promptly following approval.
 - **b.** Rejection. Requests may be rejected for any reason, at the discretion of the BCA and/or the Court.
 - c. Requests for Termination of One or More Authorized Court Data Services. The Subscriber may request the termination of an Authorized Court Data Services previously requested by submitting a notice to Court with a copy to the BCA. Promptly upon receipt of a request for termination of an Authorized Court Data Service, the BCA will deactivate the service requested. The termination of one or more Authorized Court Data Services does not terminate this Subscriber Amendment. Provisions for termination of this Subscriber Amendment are set forth in section 1. Upon termination of Authorized Court Data Services, the Subscriber shall perform the responsibilities set forth in paragraph 7(f) hereof.
- 4. SCOPE OF ACCESS TO COURT RECORDS LIMITED. Subscriber's access to and/or submission of the Court Records shall be limited to Authorized Court Data Services identified in an approved request form under section 3, above, and other Court Records necessary for Subscriber to use Authorized Court Data Services. Authorized Court Data Services shall only be used according to the instructions provided in corresponding Policies & Notices or other materials and only as necessary to assist Subscriber in the efficient performance of Subscriber's duties

required or authorized by law or court rule in connection with any civil, criminal, administrative, or arbitral proceeding in any Federal, State, or local court or agency or before any self-regulatory body. Subscriber's access to the Court Records for personal or non-official use is prohibited. Subscriber will not use or attempt to use Authorized Court Data Services in any manner not set forth in this Subscriber Amendment, Policies & Notices, or other Authorized Court Data Services documentation, and upon any such unauthorized use or attempted use the Court may immediately terminate this Subscriber Amendment without prior notice to Subscriber.

5. GUARANTEES OF CONFIDENTIALITY. Subscriber agrees:

- a. To not disclose Court Confidential Information to any third party except where necessary to carry out the Subscriber's duties as required or authorized by law or court rule in connection with any civil, criminal, administrative, or arbitral proceeding in any Federal, State, or local court or agency or before any self-regulatory body.
- **b.** To take all appropriate action, whether by instruction, agreement, or otherwise, to insure the protection, confidentiality and security of Court Confidential Information and to satisfy Subscriber's obligations under this Subscriber Amendment.
- c. To limit the use of and access to Court Confidential Information to Subscriber's bona fide personnel whose use or access is necessary to effect the purposes of this Subscriber Amendment, and to advise each individual who is permitted use of and/or access to any Court Confidential Information of the restrictions upon disclosure and use contained in this Subscriber Amendment, requiring each individual who is permitted use of and/or access to Court Confidential Information to acknowledge in writing that the individual has read and understands such restrictions. Subscriber shall keep such acknowledgements on file for one year following termination of the Subscriber Amendment and/or CJDN Subscriber Agreement, whichever is longer, and shall provide the Court with access to, and copies of, such acknowledgements upon request. For purposes of this Subscriber Amendment, Subscriber's bona fide personnel shall mean individuals who are employees of Subscriber or provide services to Subscriber either on a voluntary basis or as independent contractors with Subscriber.
- d. That, without limiting section 1 of this Subscriber Amendment, the obligations of Subscriber and its bona fide personnel with respect to the confidentiality and security of Court Confidential Information shall survive the termination of this Subscriber Amendment and the CJDN Subscriber Agreement and the termination of their relationship with Subscriber.
- e. That, notwithstanding any federal or state law applicable to the nondisclosure obligations of Subscriber and Subscriber's bona fide personnel under this Subscriber Amendment, such obligations of Subscriber and Subscriber's bona fide personnel are founded independently on the provisions of this Subscriber Amendment.
- 6. APPLICABILITY TO PREVIOUSLY DISCLOSED COURT RECORDS. Subscriber acknowledges and agrees that all Authorized Court Data Services and related Court Records disclosed to Subscriber prior to the effective date of this Subscriber Amendment shall be subject to the provisions of this Subscriber Amendment.

- 7. LICENSE AND PROTECTION OF PROPRIETARY RIGHTS. During the term of this Subscriber Amendment, subject to the terms and conditions hereof, the Court hereby grants to Subscriber a nonexclusive, nontransferable, limited license to use Court Data Services Programs and Court Data Services Databases to access or receive the Authorized Court Data Services identified in an approved request form under section 3, above, and related Court Records. Court reserves the right to make modifications to the Authorized Court Data Services, Court Data Services Programs, and Court Data Services Databases, and related materials without notice to Subscriber. These modifications shall be treated in all respects as their previous counterparts.
 - a. Court Data Services Programs. Court is the copyright owner and licensor of the Court Data Services Programs. The combination of ideas, procedures, processes, systems, logic, coherence and methods of operation embodied within the Court Data Services Programs, and all information contained in documentation pertaining to the Court Data Services Programs, including but not limited to manuals, user documentation, and passwords, are trade secret information of Court and its licensors.
 - b. Court Data Services Databases. Court is the copyright owner and licensor of the Court Data Services Databases and of all copyrightable aspects and components thereof. All specifications and information pertaining to the Court Data Services Databases and their structure, sequence and organization, including without limitation data schemas such as the Court XML Schema, are trade secret information of Court and its licensors.
 - c. Marks. Subscriber shall neither have nor claim any right, title, or interest in or use of any trademark used in connection with Authorized Court Data Services, including but not limited to the marks "MNCIS" and "Odyssey."
 - Restrictions on Duplication, Disclosure, and Use. Trade secret information d. of Court and its licensors will be treated by Subscriber in the same manner as Court Confidential Information. In addition, Subscriber will not copy any part of the Court Data Services Programs or Court Data Services Databases, or reverse engineer or otherwise attempt to discern the source code of the Court Data Services Programs or Court Data Services Databases, or use any trademark of Court or its licensors, in any way or for any purpose not specifically and expressly authorized by this Subscriber Amendment. As used herein, "trade secret information of Court and its licensors" means any information possessed by Court which derives independent economic value from not being generally known to, and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by, other persons who can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use. "Trade secret information of Court and its licensors" does not, however, include information which was known to Subscriber prior to Subscriber's receipt thereof, either directly or indirectly, from Court or its licensors, information which is independently developed by Subscriber without reference to or use of information received from Court or its licensors, or information which would not qualify as a trade secret under Minnesota law. It will not be a violation of this section 7, sub-section d, for Subscriber to make up to one copy of training materials and configuration documentation, if any, for each individual authorized to access, use, or configure Authorized Court Data Services, solely for its own use in connection with this Subscriber Amendment. Subscriber will take all steps reasonably necessary to protect the copyright, trade secret, and trademark rights of Court and its licensors and Subscriber will advise its bona fide personnel who are permitted access to any of the Court Data Services Programs and Court Data Services Databases, and trade secret information of Court and its licensors, of the restrictions upon duplication, disclosure and use contained in this Subscriber Amendment.

- e. Proprietary Notices. Subscriber will not remove any copyright or proprietary notices included in and/or on the Court Data Services Programs or Court Data Services Databases, related documentation, or trade secret information of Court and its licensors, or any part thereof, made available by Court directly or through the BCA, if any, and Subscriber will include in and/or on any copy of the Court Data Services Programs or Court Data Services Databases, or trade secret information of Court and its licensors and any documents pertaining thereto, the same copyright and other proprietary notices as appear on the copies made available to Subscriber by Court directly or through the BCA, except that copyright notices shall be updated and other proprietary notices added as may be appropriate.
- Databases, and related documentation, including but not limited to training and configuration material, if any, and logon account information and passwords, if any, made available by the Court to Subscriber directly or through the BCA and all copies, including partial copies, thereof are and remain the property of the respective licensor. Except as expressly provided in section 12.b., within ten days of the effective date of termination of this Subscriber Amendment or the CJDN Subscriber Agreement or within ten days of a request for termination of Authorized Court Data Service as described in section 4, Subscriber shall either: (i) uninstall and return any and all copies of the applicable Court Data Services Programs and Court Data Services Databases, and related documentation, including but not limited to training and configuration materials, if any, and logon account information, if any; or (2) destroy the same and certify in writing to the Court that the same have been destroyed.
- 8. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF. Subscriber acknowledges that the Court, Court's licensors, and DCA will be irreparably harmed if Subscriber's obligations under this Subscriber Amendment are not specifically enforced and that the Court, Court's licensors, and DCA would not have an adequate remedy at law in the event of an actual or threatened violation by Subscriber of its obligations. Therefore, Subscriber agrees that the Court, Court's licensors, and DCA shall be entitled to an injunction or any appropriate decree of specific performance for any actual or threatened violations or breaches by Subscriber or its bona fide personnel without the necessity of the Court, Court's licensors, or DCA showing actual damages or that monetary damages would not afford an adequate remedy. Unless Subscriber is an office, officer, agency, department, division, or bureau of the state of Minnesota, Subscriber shall be liable to the Court, Court's licensors, and DCA for reasonable attorneys fees incurred by the Court, Court's licensors, and DCA in obtaining any relief pursuant to this Subscriber Amendment.
- 9. LIABILITY. Subscriber and the Court agree that, except as otherwise expressly provided herein, each party will be responsible for its own acts and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law and shall not be responsible for the acts of any others and the results thereof. Liability shall be governed by applicable law. Without limiting the foregoing, liability of the Court and any Subscriber that is an office, officer, agency, department, division, or bureau of the state of Minnesota shall be governed by the provisions of the Minnesota Tort Claims Act, Minnesota Statutes, section 3.376, and other applicable law. Without limiting the foregoing, if Subscriber is a political subdivision of the state of Minnesota, liability of the Subscriber shall be governed by the provisions of Minn. Stat. Ch. 466 (Tort Liability, Political Subdivisions) or other applicable law. Subscriber and Court further acknowledge that the liability, if any, of the BCA is governed by a separate agreement between the Court and the BCA dated December 13, 2010 with DPS-M -0958.

The Court reserves the right to terminate this Subscriber Amendment immediately and/or temporarily suspend Subscriber's Authorized Court Data Services in the event the capacity of any host computer system or legislative appropriation of funds is determined solely by the Court to be insufficient to meet the computer needs of the courts served by the host computer system.

- 12. ADDITIONAL USER OBLIGATIONS. The obligations of the Subscriber set forth in this section are in addition to the other obligations of the Subscriber set forth elsewhere in this Subscriber Amendment.
 - a. Judicial Policy Statement. Subscriber agrees to comply with all policies identified in Policies & Notices applicable to Court Records accessed by Subscriber using Authorized Court Data Services. Upon failure of the Subscriber to comply with such policies, the Court shall have the option of immediately suspending the Subscriber's Authorized Court Data Services on a temporary basis and/or immediately terminating this Subscriber Amendment.
 - b. Access and Use; Log. Subscriber shall be responsible for all access to and use of Authorized Court Data Services and Court Records by Subscriber's bona fide personnel or by means of Subscriber's equipment or passwords, whether or not Subscriber has knowledge of or authorizes such access and use. Subscriber shall also maintain a log identifying all persons to whom Subscriber has disclosed its Court Confidential Security and Activation Information, such as user ID(s) and password(s), including the date of such disclosure. Subscriber shall maintain such logs for a minimum period of six years from the date of disclosure, and shall provide the Court with access to, and copies of, such logs upon request. The Court may conduct audits of Subscriber's logs and use of Authorized Court Data Services and Court Records from time to time. Upon Subscriber's failure to maintain such logs, to maintain accurate logs, or to promptly provide access by the Court to such logs, the Court may terminate this Subscriber Amendment without prior notice to Subscriber.
 - c. Personnel. Subscriber agrees to investigate, at the request of the Court and/or the BCA, allegations of misconduct pertaining to Subscriber's bona fide personnel having access to or use of Authorized Court Data Services, Court Confidential Information, or trade secret information of the Court and its licensors where such persons are alleged to have violated the provisions of this Subscriber Amendment, Policies & Notices, Judicial Branch policies, or other security requirements or laws regulating access to the Court Records.
 - d. Minnesota Data Practices Act Applicability. If Subscriber is a Minnesota Government entity that is subject to the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13, Subscriber acknowledges and agrees that: (1) the Court is not subject to Minn. Stat. Ch. 13 (see section 13.90) but is subject to the Rules of Public Access and other rules promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court; (2) Minn. Stat. section 13.03, subdivision 4(e) requires that Subscriber comply with the Rules of Public Access and other rules promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court for access to Court Records provided via the

BCA systems and tools under this Subscriber Amendment; (3) the use of and access to Court Records may be restricted by rules promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court, applicable state statute or federal law; and (4) these applicable restrictions must be followed in the appropriate circumstances.

- 13. FEES; INVOICES. Unless the Subscriber is an office, officer, department, division, agency, or bureau of the state of Minnesota, Subscriber shall pay the fees, if any, set forth in applicable Policies & Notices, together with applicable sales, use or other taxes. Applicable monthly fees commence ten (10) days after notice of approval of the request pursuant to section 3 of this Subscriber Amendment or upon the initial Subscriber transaction as defined in the Policies & Notices, whichever occurs earlier. When fees apply, the Court shall invoice Subscriber on a monthly basis for charges incurred in the preceding month and applicable taxes, if any, and payment of all amounts shall be due upon receipt of invoice. If all amounts are not paid within 30 days of the date of the invoice, the Court may immediately cancel this Subscriber Amendment without notice to Subscriber and pursue all available legal remedies. Subscriber certifies that funds have been appropriated for the payment of charges under this Subscriber Amendment for the current fiscal year, if applicable.
- **MODIFICATION OF FEES.** Court may modify the fees by amending the Policies & Notices as provided herein, and the modified fees shall be effective on the date specified in the Policies & Notices, which shall not be less than thirty days from the publication of the Policies & Notices. Subscriber shall have the option of accepting such changes or terminating this Subscriber Amendment as provided in section 1 hereof.

15. WARRANTY DISCLAIMERS.

- a. WARRANTY EXCLUSIONS. EXCEPT AS SPECIFICALLY AND EXPRESSLY PROVIDED HEREIN, COURT, COURT'S LICENSORS, AND DCA MAKE NO REPRESENTATIONS OR WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE WARRANTIES OF FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR MERCHANTABILITY, NOR ARE ANY WARRANTIES TO BE IMPLIED, WITH RESPECT TO THE INFORMATION, SERVICES OR COMPUTER PROGRAMS MADE AVAILABLE UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.
- b. ACCURACY AND COMPLETENESS OF INFORMATION. WITHOUT LIMITING THE GENERALITY OF THE PRECEDING PARAGRAPH, COURT, COURT'S LICENSORS, AND DCA MAKE NO WARRANTIES AS TO THE ACCURACY OR COMPLETENESS OF THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE COURT RECORDS.
- 16. RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES. Subscriber is an independent contractor and shall not be deemed for any purpose to be an employee, partner, agent or franchisee of the Court, Court's licensors, or DCA. Neither Subscriber nor the Court, Court's licensors, or DCA shall have the right nor the authority to assume, create or incur any liability or obligation of any kind, express or implied, against or in the name of or on behalf of the other.
- 17. NOTICE. Except as provided in section 2 regarding notices of or modifications to Authorized Court Data Services and Policies & Notices, any notice to Court or Subscriber

hereunder shall be deemed to have been received when personally delivered in writing or seventy-two (72) hours after it has been deposited in the United States mail, first class, proper postage prepaid, addressed to the party to whom it is intended at the address set forth on page one of this Agreement or at such other address of which notice has been given in accordance herewith.

- 18. NON-WAIVER. The failure by any party at any time to enforce any of the provisions of this Subscriber Amendment or any right or remedy available hereunder or at law or in equity, or to exercise any option herein provided, shall not constitute a waiver of such provision, remedy or option or in any way affect the validity of this Subscriber Amendment. 

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Agreement between Mid-MN Inspections LLC and the City of Milaca, MN for Building Official Services

Agreement

This agreement is between the City of Milaca, ("City") Minnesota, a subdivision of the state of Minnesota and Mid-MN Inspections LLC ("Mid-MN"), a domestic limited liability company. The purpose of the agreement is to memorialize the understanding of services rendered and payment therefore as related to services as a building official in the city of Milaca, MN.

Term of the Agreement

- **1.1 Effective Date:** The date of this Agreement shall become effective on the date of the last signature.
- **1.2 Expiration Date:** This Agreement shall expire one year from the date of the last signature, unless reauthorized by both parties.

Agreement between the Parties

Audit Clause
