## STATE OF THE CITIES HELD FEBRUARY 20 AT MILACA ELIM HOME

On Tuesday, February 20, the State of the Cities was held at the Milaca Elim Home. This event is an opportunity for mayors and city managers from surrounding communities to give an update on the progress of their city.

The following is the presentation that City Manager Tammy Pfaff gave and we would like to share with each of you.

*Good Morning, Thank you, I am pleased to be here with all of you today. I would like to take a moment to give a special thanks to the Mayor and City Council and all who were in support of allowing me the honor of serving as City Manager for this great city.*

*When I began last May, I was inundated with support and guidance from council and staff. The first six months were a whirlwind of many changes that were put into motion which in turn resulted in many positive outcomes for the city and our citizens. We have dedicated staff that work hard to make sure everything is running smooth in our city.*

*Let me take this opportunity to share with you some of our successes:*

- ◆ *We have made many improvements to our city parks with the addition of camping sites and we have new equipment coming in the spring of 2018 by the graces of a \$30,000 donation by Bill Hjort to install a children's Zipline and a 7 foot boulder for Rec Park. We honor another wonderful donation from Dorothy Gorecki for \$3,000 for the sound boards for the Gorecki building. They deserve a round of applause. We thank you very much for these generous donations.*
- ◆ *The Public Works and Parks Department were combined into one department and resulted in a decrease in wages for the city. The department is now running very efficiently.*

- ◆ *The council initiated goals for 2017 with 73 action items listed. Within 8 months after I began, 46 of these items have been completed or are in the process of being completed. We are making great strides to continue to improve our city.*
- ◆ *The Industrial Park property was sold to Heggies Pizza for their business to expand in the future and to keep them in our community for many years to come.*
- ◆ *As for the 2017 Budget: The General Fund Revenues exceeded expenditures by 13% and for the enterprise funds the water fund revenues exceeded expenditures by 57%, and I will note we are building the funds for the future water project improvements scheduled for 2019. The Sewer fund revenues exceeded expenditures by 30% and the Liquor fund revenues exceeded expenditures by 10%. In September the debt for the liquor store was paid off early, which resulted in savings of over \$26,000 in interest.*
- ◆ *The City in 2017 paid debt service payments of \$497,799.00, and we also refunded the EDA debt for a savings in interest payments of over \$24,000.00. The total outstanding debt for the city is \$3,920,000.00.*
- ◆ *As for the tax levy in 2017 there was an increase of 2.5% which was a decrease from the previous year 2016. We will work to improve our city and when possible we will generate savings that can be passed on to all the taxpayers.*

*Thank you, and I am looking forward to working with everyone in our community.*


## NEW SIGNAGE COMING TO MILACA



Have you seen it yet? Here is the new City of Milaca sign that has been placed out on Highway 169. This new sign will feature advertisement for Heggies Pizza. Some of you may be asking, "why Heggies?"

Previously the land that this sign was built on belonged to the city. Heggies has purchased the remaining land in the Industrial Park area for their future expansion which included land this sign was sitting on. With Heggies now owning this land, they have given the city permission to keep the sign on "their" land. With this granted permission, the city felt it was only fair to put Heggies advertisement on the sign.

Also, during the coming months, you will notice new street signs being erected in the city. The Department of Transportation (DOT) and Federal Highway Administration required that by January 2015 regulatory and warning signs be replaced with new high visibility display signs and that by January 2018 all street signs be replaced with high visibility display signs (HVD). The new signs will be larger and brighter resulting in them being easier to see from a further distance away and will have our city logo.




# NEW HOURS FOR MILACA LIBRARY

Effective Sunday, March 4, the Milaca Public Library has new hours

According to Carla Lydon, East Central Regional Library (ECRL) Executive Director, these changes are a culmination of a multi-year process during which time ECRL sought public feedback in its communities and consulted staff, board members, and local officials in an effort to better balance library resources across its six-county region.

Prior to this, open hours had remained the same for more than a decade, despite changes in facilities, communities and traffic patterns. It is the library's hope that these new schedules will better serve the pub-

lic and provide appropriate staffing levels to continue to provide the excellent customer service that people rely on when visiting ECRL libraries.

# GOLF CART PERMITS NOW DUE



Warm weather is on the way and that may make you think of golf! This is just a reminder that golf permits are due each year. This permit is required if you drive a golf cart within the City of Milaca. There is no cost for the permit but we do need

to have your golf cart registered with the city.

Just a reminder also, that if you drive a side-by-side, otherwise known as a UVT, you will also need a permit for those as well.

bar and select Motorized Golf Cart Permit Application. Complete that form and mail or drop off at city hall and we will get your permit mailed out to you (or you can pick it up).



## CITY WIDE CLEAN UP DAY APRIL 28

The City of Milaca city-wide clean up day will be held Saturday, **April 28** (hopefully mother nature will cooperate!).

If snow is gone and it has been warm enough to start cleaning up, Jim's Mille Lacs Disposal will be picking up bagged, boxed or bundled leaves, grass clippings and smaller branches.

Jim's Mille Lacs Disposal is requesting these items be placed out at your street curb (not alley) by 6 am. If need be, set these items out the night before.

This is a pick up for **ONLY** leaves, grass clippings and small branches.

Should you not be able to have your items ready this day, the city will once again be having a large dumpster at Jim's Mille Lacs Disposal located at 205 2nd Ave NE in which your leaves, grass clippings and smaller branches can be disposed of at no charge beginning April 1 (**weather depending**).

If the leaves or grass clippings are in plastic bags, please remove the bag before placing in the dumpster. Just a reminder that these items can **only** be dumped during recycling hours. **PLEASE do not leave items when dumpster door is closed.**

## SPLASH PAD OPENING MAY 25



Splash pad will be opening on Friday, May 25, Memorial Weekend. Hours will be from 10 am —8 pm daily. There is no charge for use of the splash pad but please remember we cannot "reserve" the splash pad for parties or group events.

Activities at the splash pad include six above-ground water-spraying stations as well as other spouts that are hidden and many buckets and sprayers. The splash pad features shallow water but there is no swimming area.

Don't forget about the new equipment added in Rec Park: the zip line and the climbing boulder. What great new additions to the park!



## CITY WIDE GARAGE SALE

The City of Milaca will **not** be having a city-wide garage sale in May. The only one we will be having this year will be in July in conjunction with Rec Fest. For more information, contact Mayor Pete Pedersen at 320-237-2657 directly. Staff at city hall will not be taking names and addresses—you will need to contact Mayor Pedersen.

## CAMPING IN REC PARK

Starting in 2018, limited camping will be allowed in Rec Park by permit!



There will be 4 sites available for RV or tenting. Each site will have a class 5 parking pad, water and electricity. No sewer. If you will need to dump your grey/wastewater, Jim's Mille Lacs Disposal has a dumping station (but they recommend dumping after business hours so their trucks will not get blocked in). They are located 3 blocks east of Rec Park.

Camping will be allowed ONLY if a permit has been obtained from the police department first. On this permit it must be indicated if there will be alcoholic beverages at the camp site.

The following are some of the rules for camping:

- ◆ Permit MUST be issued by police department
- ◆ Maximum 3 day/night consecutive stay
- ◆ Check out is 11:00 a.m.
- ◆ Check in is 2:00 p.m.
- ◆ 1 vehicle per site (unless camping unit pulled by a vehicle)
- ◆ No alcoholic beverages without permit
- ◆ Fires in designated area only
- ◆ Pets must be on a leash unless in designated running area
- ◆ No fireworks/firearms
- ◆ Quiet hours 10:00 pm–6:00 am (unless special event in park)
- ◆ All campers must be at their camp site by 10 pm, unless there is a special event in the park.

Campers must obey all local ordinances, including, park hours of 6 am to 10 pm.

Restrooms and a shower are located in the Gorecki Community Center (west entrance by splash pad).

To obtain a permit, please contact the Milaca Police Non-Emergency at 320-983-6166 or stop in at city hall to see if an officer is available.

If you need a permit after regular business hours, please contact Mille Lacs County Dispatch at 320-983-8257 and they will dispatch the officer on duty for assistance.

If you have questions in regard to camping, please call city hall at 320-983-3141 or the Milaca Police Department at 320-983-6166.

Please also refer to City of Milaca Ordinance Chapter #90 on Public Parks.



## PUBLIC WORKS/CITY HALL

When there's a sewer line break, sprinkler ban, low-pressure alert, or the need to advise residents to boil their water, Public Alert provides a direct way to inform residents!



## FIRE DEPT.

Time is always of the essence. If residents need to be alerted of local grass fires, street flooding, or traffic detours because of any of the above, there is no better method than Public Alert to spread the message quickly!

### Public-Alert Features:

- Public Alert is a fast solution to communicate with residents! Over 200 messages can be sent every second
- Your department users can access it from any computer, smartphone or tablet anywhere, anytime 24/7
- Public-Alert maintains your database so that only you can have access, no third party.
- Database files are encrypted, password protected
- Databases are backed every day and each backup is kept for 30 days.
- Automatic upload of selected database' from utilities or other customer records

### Alerts can be sent...

- Automated SMS text
- Automated Emails
- Automated Phone calls

### Available Soon

- Image & video messaging
- Weather alerts
- Facebook Notifications

### Special Options for Residents

- Residents or businesses can directly edit contact information on web.
- Residents or businesses can select preferred contact method of receiving alerts.
- Residents can have multiply contact methods for additional adults in home.
- Residents can opt into of selected special alerts, more informational non-emergency alerts

What does all this mean? The City of Milaca will be installing software from Public Alert. With this software program, the city will be able to send messages via landline phone, text message or email to alert our residents of emergency situations or situations that we feel we would need to notify you of something. For example, should there be a water main break in a certain area of town, we would be able to send an alert to just those residents that water services will be off for this repair. Another example, we would call all our residents to remind you of the No Parking on city streets from November 1 to April 1 from 1 am to 6 am.

These are just a couple of examples. In order to proceed with this Public Alert program, the City will be mailing out to all residents a form. On this form you will indicate if you wish to participate in this alert system and if so, you will indicate the alert option (email, text or phone) and the appropriate phone number(s). Once you receive this form and information, if you have additional questions or concerns, please call city hall and we will do our best to answer and address your concerns.

## Remodeling

Are you considering a major remodel or improvement for your home? If so, this is the time to also address nagging problems such as high energy bills, comfort issues, health concerns, mold/moisture, etc. Opening up walls and ceilings or adding new equipment offers the best and most cost efficient opportunity to solve these problems. Don't screw this up!



The family room addition features roofline and walls insulated with spray-applied cellulose.


### What's the Problem?

Very few contractors are trained to connect the dots between the project you hired them for and chronic existing problems in your home. It is up to you to think beyond the need at hand – kitchen, siding, roof, furnace, etc. There are good solutions, and NOW is the time to implement them.

### Solving the Problem

Some effort and oversight on your part will result in a considerably better home at the end of the remodel. Here are some typical projects along with add-on solutions for nagging problems:

- ◆ Exterior siding: Add insulation from the outside, add house wrap to reduce air leaks, air-seal around vents, pipes, and wiring, fix window flashing, address water problems
- ◆ Roof: Address ice dam and comfort issues by air sealing and insulating hard to reach places like vaults or top plates of exterior walls, improve attic ventilation
- ◆ Removing plaster or sheetrock from walls: Air seal gaps or openings, add insulation, seal ductwork



- ◆ Ceilings and Attics: Air seal vents, pipes, wiring and recessed can lights, add insulation to attics, insulate and seal duct work, add bath and kitchen fans
- ◆ Heating equipment: invest in high efficiency equipment, seal duct work, add return ducts
- ◆ Replace water heater: If you have a natural draft water heater replace it with a power vented or sealed combustion water heater. Natural draft units are inefficient and can back draft carbon monoxide and other pollutants into your updated home. They are not installed in new homes in Minnesota, why put one in yours?
- ◆ Project quality control: Ensure the remodeling project is not creating new air leaks, insulation gaps, problems with carbon monoxide and other pollutants, new mold/moisture issues.
